
Endangered Animals



4th Grade Research Project Westwood Elementary

Introduction

What does the Black-footed Ferret, African Elephant, California Condor and many other species have in common? They are endangered. This means their numbers have been greatly reduced. For example, in the 1800's, the Black-footed Ferret had a population between 500,000 and 1 million. Today, they number about 700 in the wild and about 350 in captivity. These animals need your help! You are their voice to plead for their survival!

Task 1 - Finding Sources (1 day)

- 1. Choose an animal from the <u>E-Species Fact Sheet List</u> that you would like to save.
- 2. Check with your teacher to make sure someone else does not have that animal.
- 3. Now go to the <u>library catalog</u> for Westwood to find books on your animal.
- 4. Click on the catalog tab.
- 5. Type in the name of your animal to find books on the topic.
- 6. Check your books out. (THEY WILL STAY IN THE LIBRARY)
- 7. Books may also have a list of websites in the back.
- 8. You may also want to use the Webpath Express under the catalog tab to find websites on your animal.
- WHEN YOU FIND A WEBSITE THAT YOU WANT TO USE, ASK A
 TEACHER TO PRINT THE INFORMATION FOR YOU.

Task 2 - Reading (1-2 days)

- 1. Read the note sheet (<u>Appendix A</u>) to familiarize yourself with the type of information that you will need to find.
- 2. Read through the sources (books & website info). When you find the information, mark it with sticky notes.
- 3. Suggestions for saving endangered animals can be found at World Wildlife Federation (Act Now) http://www.worldwildlife.org/how/fun/index.html. STAY ONLY IN THE ACT NOW PORTION OF THE SITE.

Task 3 - Taking Notes & Creating Bibliography (1 day)

- Review the note sheet information and the information you marked with sticky notes.
- 2. Take notes. REMEMBER, the notes are not in complete sentences. They are like Mom's grocery list.
- 3. Create a bibliography (Appendix B) of the sources you used.

Task 4 - Persuasive Techniques in Advertising (Teacher Instruction) (1 day)

- 2. Review Scoring Rubric (Appendix C)
- 3. Begin podcast rough draft

Task 5 - Continue Writing Podcast (2 days)

- Finish rough draft.
- 2. Check rough draft by looking at the criteria of the scoring rubric (Appendix C).
- 3. Have a neighbor and a teacher check it.
- 4. Write final copy.
- 5. Fluency Practice reading the podcast with fluency.

Task 6 - Learn How to Use Audacity (Teacher Instruction) (1 day)

1. Mrs. Hudson will teach the students how to use Audacity.

Task 7 - Create Podcast (? Days)

- 1. Find a quiet place where you can record.
- 2. Begin recording your podcast. (Remember about fluency)!
- 3. Once you are satisfied with the quality of the podcast, use the rubric to make sure you meet the criteria for a 4.
- 4. Save your podcast as a MP3 file.
